B. Evidence for Syllable Integrity

Construct an argument for Syllable Integrity based on loan word clippings in Japanese.

To do this, show that if Syllable Integrity holds, you can account for the systematic gap in loan word clippings by means of a prosodic template that not only accounts for the maximum length of loan word clippings, but also accounts for the systematic gap in the distribution of light and heavy syllables in loan word clippings.
