Corporate Personality Creature theory Group theory Person theory **Creature Theory** • The corporation is a creature of the state for it exists thanks to the act of incorporation. • Unlike a natural person, a corporation has no pre-existing rights. • The only rights are those spelled out in its charter. • As a legal entity it is a persona ficta, an artificial or juristic person. **Group Theory** • Man, as an independent and free being, has the right to join freely with other persons and to form associations. • Those associations can take on an existence of their own. • However, corporate rights in reality are the rights of the component members. • A corporate name is nothing other than a way of recognizing the members of the group.

Person Theory

- Groups are natural entities with human societies.
- A group is as real as the persons who form it.
- A group is more than just a collection of persons with a common interest, for it takes on an existence of its own.
- The corporation is a legal person <u>naturally</u>, as much as any human being.

Relation between society and corporations

- The creature theory emphasizes the power of the sovereign or the state.
- The group theory recognizes the contractual rights of individuals to join together.
- The person theory elevates the corporation as a "bearer of rights and duties" (as much as any live person).
